### God Revealed Colossians 1:15-17

"<sup>9</sup> And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, <sup>10</sup> so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him: bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; <sup>11</sup> being strengthened with all power, according to his glorious might, for all endurance and patience with joy; <sup>12</sup> giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. <sup>13</sup> He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, <sup>14</sup> in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. <sup>15</sup> He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. <sup>16</sup> For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. <sup>17</sup> And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together."

"Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, <sup>2</sup> but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. <sup>3</sup> He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. ## I. The image of the invisible God.

- What Think Ye of Christ, Is the Test by John Newton What think ye of Christ? Is the test To try both your state and your scheme; You cannot be right in the rest, Unless you think rightly of him; As Jesus appears in your view, As he is beloved or not,
- So God is disposed to you,
- And mercy, or wrath are your lot.

### II. Christ is the head and sustainer of all creation. (vv. 15b-17)

## III. Christ is the one who brings wholeness, joy, and shalom to our lives. (v. 17)

• If Christ is the image of the invisible God: I find purpose and dignity in his Word and work upon the cross.

• If Christ made all creation: then I rejoice in the beauty, goodness, and wonder of all creation (and live as an environmental steward).

- If Christ is the sustaining agent of all creation: I sleep well.
- If all things were made for Christ: then I find delight in joyful obedience.

• If in Christ all things hold together: I pursue this One who gives wholeness and purpose.
