Today's Text: Ephesians 5:15-17

"Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, ¹⁶ making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. ¹⁷ Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is." **Ephesians 5:15-17**
